Purpose:

 Improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries for all users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users, motorists, etc.

Our Current Reality

Traffic fatalities are a public health crisis affecting all road users.

In 2020, someone was **killed or seriously injured** in a crash on average **every 4.5 hours** in the Greater Philadelphia region.



Fatalities have disparate impacts...

Nationally, **pedestrian fatalities** are overrepresented **among minority populations**.

42.5% of the DVRPC region's **pedestrian fatalities occurred in** DVRPC **underserved** communities ('16-'20).

SS4A Grant Types

Action Plan Grants: Fund development of Vision Zero Action Plan or similar Implementation Grants: Fund projects and strategies identified in a qualifying safety action plan



SS4A Funding and Schedule \$5B over FY22-26, \$1B in first round (2022)

- 80% Federal / 20% Local Match (in-kind services eligible):
 - Action Plan Grants: Locals 200K/1M, MPOs 200K/5M
 - Implementation Grants: Locals 5M/30M, MPOs 5M/50M
- Schedule & Period of Performance:
 - Action Plan 12 to 24 months
 - Implementation Plan 5 years

2022 SS4A NOFO - Process

Funding Restrictions:

- Per state cap of 15% of total SS4A funds (action plans & impl grants)
- Grant distribution: 40% for Action Plans , 60% for Implementation

Evaluation:

- Screen for duplicative Action Plan Grant applications in same location
 FY 2023 NOFO also
- Rank grants based on merit criteria



Application

SS4A Selection Criteria - Action Plan Grants

1. Safety Impact:

- Total crash fatalities 2016 to 2020
- 5-year annual average fatality rate (population)

2. Equity:

- Percentage of population in Underserved Communities (Census tract %)
- 3. Additional Safety Considerations (300 words)



2022 SS4A NOFO - Awards

Awarded:

- 474 Action Plan Grants (vast maj of apps were funded)
 10 in New Jersey = \$6,545,671!
- **37** Implementation Grants
 1 in NJ City of Vineland = \$20,000,000

NOT Awarded: 163 Implementation Grants - 6 in New Jersey





Regional Vision Zero 2050 Action Program

Components Unique to DVRPC's Program

Local Plan Vetting

- Review of recent/forthcoming county and local plans for inclusion in the regional plan–qualifying them for future SS4A implementation, other funding
- Integrated regional pipeline for local safety planning and project development

Data Dashboard and Online Platform

- Action Program tracking
- Regional HIN & supporting safety data map layers
- Interface for connecting with the public, crowdsourcing safety concerns

The Action Plan Planning Process



U.S. Department of Transportation

County Participation in Program:

- Similar to involvement in an average-sized county-focused UPWP project
- 2-year timeline
- Ongoing collaboration to create a sustainable safety management system beyond SS4A

Next Steps

SS4A FY 2023 Application Round

- Assist partner agencies w/apps
- Coordinate to ensure proposals are complementary to RVZ 2050
 - Supplemental activities
 - Demonstration projects

Tips for Planning and Demonstration Grant Applicants

- Applicants without complete Action Plans may request funds for supplemental planning and demonstration activities, so long as Action Plans are in development.
- You do not have to be the community who has/is developing the Action Plan, as long as you are within the scope of the application and coordinate with the place with the Action Plan.
- Including demonstration activities with a new Action Plan is a great way to start engaging your community to re-imagine roadway safety.
